In Minor Keys' performative gestures centre the body as a site of knowledge and memory, as well as a political vessel for collective resistance, healing and joy. The call is to breathe and listen to the music that resides in the water, air, fire and earth. Movement, recitation, call-and-response, and other poetic offerings radiate through the exhibition spaces and out into the Giardini and Arsenale grounds, lighting lanterns for the journey ahead.

Blessing the Ancestors

For over two centuries, the Black Masking Culture of New Orleans has carried forward an ancestral ritual standing both as a ceremonial procession and a public activation of the traditional suit exclusively sewn and worn by the community's shepherd also known as Big Chief. Demond Melancon brings this living practice to the Giardini, wearing his 2020 *Jah Defender* suit, a work on show throughout the duration of the Exhibition. Accompanied by members of the Young Seminole Hunters from the Lower Ninth Ward, Big Chief calls for the blessings of those who have departed from Earth but stay alive as sentinels watching after the community.

*Reverie of Collective
Walkers (Reading to Plants)*

An ambulatory reading performance where participants are invited to walk among plants and read aloud from a site-specific library of texts in multiple languages, or bring their own stories and poems where plants are protagonists and human-botanical entanglements take centre stage. The collective gesture creates a horizontal dialogue with the more-than-human world. The addressees are the plants themselves, who receive, in return, the CO2 released in the act of reading.

A rubber boat moves through the crowd. Onboard, DJ LaLa plays live as drag queens lead the way. The boat is pulled by participants as the shared burdens and acts of care. The performance honours those who refused to be silenced: activists, artists, friends taken too soon by AIDS. Drawing on the last scene of Federico Fellini's *Nights of Cabiria*, where a grief-stricken woman's resolve is boosted back to life by a crowd of strangers singing and dancing in the street, the *Procession for Fallen Comrades and Fallen Angels* moves from mourning to solidarity. The boat carries loss, but also resilience and joy.

Whispering in III Movements

Where Sound Becomes Color, Color Becomes Breath.

A multi-sensory performance that dissolves the boundaries between music, visual art, aromatherapy and neural frequency therapy. Created by Maria Magdalena Campos-Pons and Kamaal Malak, the work unfolds across three immersive movements. Live music, painting, botanical essences and various materials are drawn into a single unified field of sensation. Scent moves through the air. Bass frequencies resonate through the body. Images shift and dissolve in real time. Malak and Campos-Pons invite all guests to think about what it means to be fully present: to listen not just with the ears but with the skin, the breath and the soul.

Kayayei Momome activates Udondian's installation *Obroni Wawu* – an Akan term meaning “dead white man's clothes”, referring to the second-hand garments imported from Western countries into African markets. Seven women – wearing handcrafted headdresses inspired by the kayayei, women who carry heavy loads – process through the Giardino delle Vergini reminding the ghostly presence of migrant communities who carry everyday workloads often rendered invisible in Western geographies. Drawing on Akan ritual traditions of procession and purification, the performance transforms labour, resistance and care into a site of empowerment and energetic renewal.

Words hang in the air, move from tongues to ears au gré des vents, words penetrate the soil as clandestine fertiliser, their sounds, rhythms and melodies perfuming the air. –Koyo Kouoh, 2000

In 1999, Koyo Kouoh brought together nine African poets for a poetry caravan by road from Dakar to Timbuktu. This procession of poets and musicians honours that journey and the vision she brought to the 61st International Art Exhibition. In the tradition of the *griots* – those who for centuries carried the stories of the people and their lives – poets assemble and cycle through seven stations in the Giardini, gathering others as they hum, recite, sing, improvise, chant and howl. This communal act seeks to concretise resilience through gesture and movement.

Gongs, voice and percussion. Sound as medicine, vibration as care. Around a table in a dark room, a séance unfolds. Objects – relics of displaced and uprooted lives, witnesses to colonial violence – sit at the center. A historian acts as medium, calling forth absent guests through a multi-alphabetical Ouija board, and the collective mental presence of those gathered. The knowledges held within each object are gradually released through the coalescing of energies and questions posed to the spirits. A cohort of experts reveal unwritten pasts. Here, history is non-linear and experiences lost are conjured.

Drawing from his own experience of cancer, Maravilla discovered the restorative power of sound firsthand. In Zurich in the late 1980s, a nomadic club night gathered momentum in defiance of strict nightlife laws. The name Parfumerie was born after its founders came across a discarded perfumer's neon sign, and hence the sign was carried from party to party to "inject perfume into the city". The spirit of this DIY cultural and social experimentation temporarily inhabits the Casetta Scaffali in the Giardino delle Vergini. This set by one of Parfumerie's original DJs reactivates and carries forward its space-making energy as a tribute to the scene, its people and the creative freedom they claimed in the peripheries of the city.

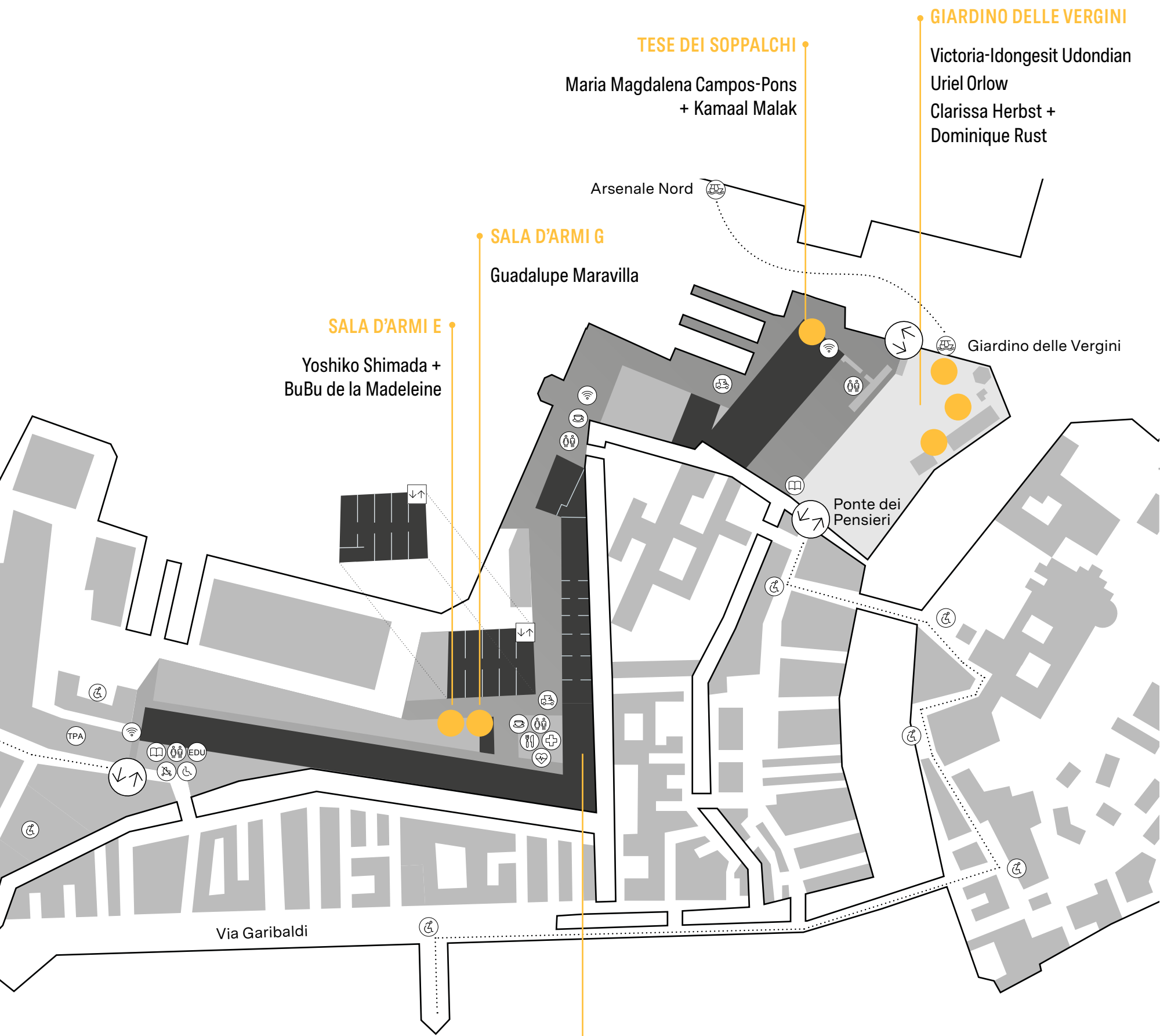

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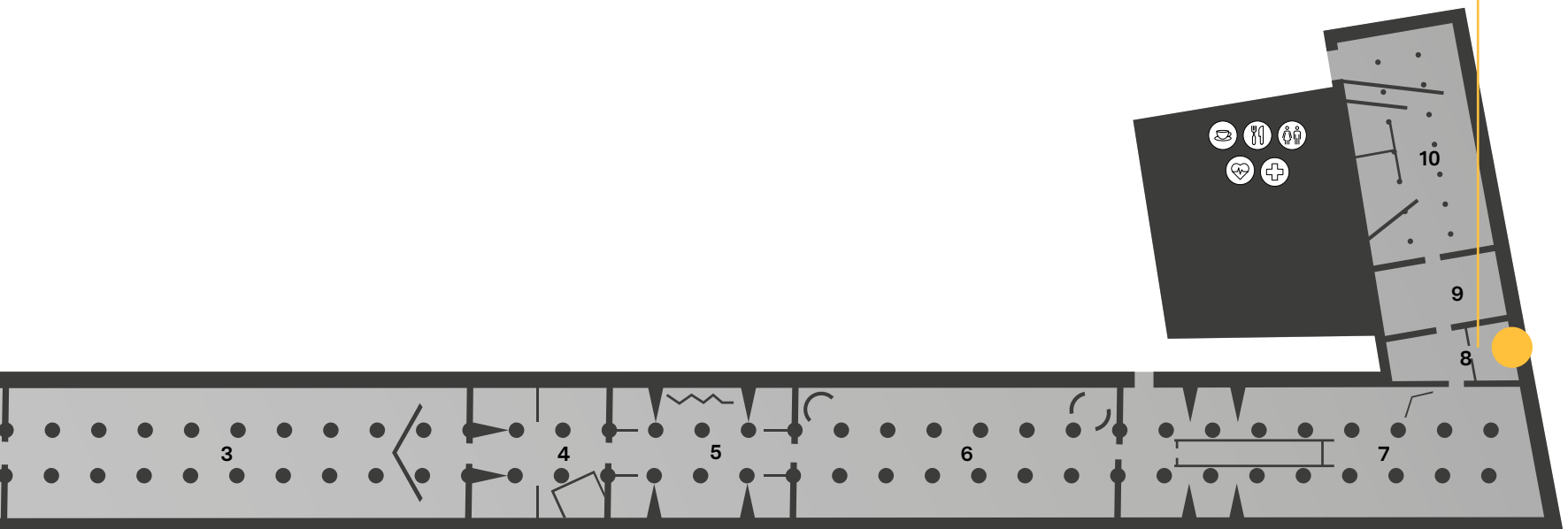
