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The Wooster Group

The Wooster Group è una compagnia di artisti di teatro sperimentale e arti multimediali, guidata dalla regista e fondatrice Elizabeth LeCompte.

Dal 1975 la compagnia ha creato oltre 40 opere teatrali e 22 opere multimediali. Tra le opere dirette da LeCompte si ricordano: *Rumstick Road* (1977), la coreografia *For the Good Times* (1982), *L.S.D. (...Just the High Points...)* (1984), *Brace Up!* (1991), *The Hairy Ape* (1996), *House/Lights* (1998), *To You, the Birdie!* (*Péchére*) (2002), *Hamlet* (2006), l'opera *La Didone* (2008), *Vieux Carré* (2009), *The Room* (2015), *The Town Hall Affair* (2017), *A Pink Chair* (*In Place of a Fake Antique*) (2018), e *The Mother* (2021).

Tra le opere multimediali: *White Homeland Commando* (1992), *Wrong Guys* (1997), la video installazione a 360° *There Is Still Time... Brother* (2007), e la serie di cortometraggi e video d'archivio *Dailies* (2010-2020).

Kate Valk firma la regia di *Early Shaker Spirituals: A Record Album Interpretation* (2014), oltre a *The B-Side: Negro Folklore from Texas State Prisons* (2017) e *Get Your Ass in the Water and Swim Like Me* (2024), entrambe in collaborazione con Eric Berryman.

The Wooster Group ha preso parte a diverse esposizioni in musei e gallerie d'arte tra cui tre partecipazioni alla Whitney Biennial, la mostra *The Body Electric* al Walker Art Center, e un excursus sull'opera della compagnia nella galleria Carriage Trade di New York.

LeCompte è stata insignita del Dorothy and Lillian Gish Prize, della John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation fellowship, del Doris Duke Performing Artist award alla prima edizione ed è Cavaliere dell'Ordre des Arts et des Lettres del governo francese.

Le sono stati inoltre conferiti due dottorati honoris causa, dalla New School e dal California Institute of the Arts. Nel 2025 riceve il Leone d'Oro alla carriera della Biennale Teatro.

The Wooster Group ha sede al Performing Garage in SoHo (New York), ed è stato fondato da Elizabeth LeCompte, Spalding Gray, Ron Vawter, Jim Clayburgh, Willem Dafoe, Kate Valk, e Peyton Smith.

About The Wooster Group

The Wooster Group, led by founding member and director Elizabeth LeCompte, is a company of experimental theatre and media artists.

Since 1975, the Group has created more than 40 theatre works and 22 media pieces. Productions include: *Rumstick Road* (1977), the dance *For the Good Times* (1982), *L.S.D. (...Just the High Points...)* (1984), *Brace Up!* (1991), *The Hairy Ape* (1996), *House/Lights* (1998), *To You, the Birdie!* (*Péchére*) (2002), *Hamlet* (2006), the opera *La Didone* (2008), *Vieux Carré* (2009), *The Room* (2015), *The Town Hall Affair* (2017), *A Pink Chair* (*In Place of a Fake Antique*) (2018), and *The Mother* (2021), all directed by LeCompte.

Media pieces include: *White Homeland Commando* (1992), *Wrong Guys* (1997), the 360° video installation, *There Is Still Time... Brother* (2007), and the *Dailies* (2010-2020), an online series of short original and archival videos.

Kate Valk has directed *Early Shaker Spirituals: A Record Album Interpretation* (2014), as well as two collaborations with Eric Berryman: *The B-Side: Negro Folklore from Texas State Prisons* (2017) and *Get Your Ass in the Water and Swim Like Me* (2024).

The Group has been included in numerous museum and gallery shows, among them three Whitney Biennials, *The Body Electric* at the Walker Art Center, and an exhibition devoted to the Group's work at carriage trade in 2019-20.

LeCompte has received the Dorothy and Lillian Gish Prize, a John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation fellowship, the Chevalier des Arts et des Lettres, and an inaugural Doris Duke Performing Artist award. She has received honorary doctorates from the New School and California Institute of the Arts. In 2025, she was awarded the Venice Biennale's Golden Lion for Lifetime Achievement in Theatre.

Based at The Performing Garage in the SoHo neighbourhood of New York City, the Group was founded by Elizabeth LeCompte, Spalding Gray, Ron Vawter, Jim Clayburgh, Willem Dafoe, Kate Valk, and Peyton Smith. To learn more, visit www.thewoostergroup.org.
